Toddler Room

This week in the toddler room we will be welcoming our new theme :

"Let's Investigate Mini beasts"

We will be having our own caterpillars delivered

to nursery to take care of and observe the changes over the next week and learn about the life cycle of a butterfly.

In the playdough we will be creating long and short caterpillars.

I wonder how many you can make?

On the finger gym we will be using laces and pipe cleaners as our pretend caterpillars and get them to eat around the leaves.

In the art studio we will be exploring mixing colours with our fingers moving them through the paint across the paper like a caterpillar. "I wonder what happens when the red meets the white?"

Preschool

This week in pre-school we will be starting a new topic: 'Let's Investigate Minibeasts'.

We will be learning all about minibeasts from the Exotic Zoo visit on Tuesday and in the small world area we will be building homes for minibeasts using a range of reclaimed materials and construction kits.

In the art studio we will be making a snail collage in the style of 'Henri Matisse' and in the playdough we will be making our own minibeasts, counting out six legs.

Health Information

Is my child too ill for nursery?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school or nursery when they're unwell.

There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about managing infectious diseases. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school or nursery each day your child is absent unless the school or nursery agrees a different arrangement. You must let the school or nursery know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let the school office know.

Health Protection Advice Measles

Cases of measles are increasing in the UK, including in the West Midlands, and it's likely that there will be cases in Telford in the near future.

Measles can have serious and sometimes fatal consequences, so make sure your children are up to date with MMR vaccinations, and ask your GP about catch-up jabs if needed. The MMR vaccine is highly effective at protecting against measles.

If you are concerned that your child has measles, please call your GP in the first instance, to reduce the risk of passing the disease to others in the waiting room.
