Thankyou to all parents that have been sending in photos for our I am proud board, the book we are sharing is all about babies celebrating with their families.


The babies will be exploring green jelly play through their senses **Smell, taste, touch, hearing, sight** and making marks with their tiny fingers and hands. Metal jugs, and bowls and spoons will be added for babies to learn to scoop and explore how containers can be filled and emptied.

The songs of the week will be 'Jelly on a plate wibble wobble' and 'Poly put the kettle on' staff have made sensory song sacks to use with the babies at singing times.

In diddy disco this week we will be continuing to listen to move our bodies to a range of pop music celebrating black history month staff have chosen some classic tracks to encourage new gross motor movements using scarves and ribbons.

We will also be exploring a range of natural objects and big and little blocks. Learning how to bang them together, pass them from hand to hand and begin to construct adding one brick on top of another.

In the role play area, babies will be pretending to cook using pots and pans on the play cooker adults will be modelling how to mix with spoons, pour with jugs, also feeding and giving drinks to teddies and baby dolls using spoons, bottles and cups.



Toddler Room

Next week in the Toddler room the female role model we will be celebrating for Black History month is **Alma Thomas**. In the art studio we will be looking at her inspirational artwork and creating our own brightly coloured collages.

We will be sharing the story "Baby goes to market" and creating fruit using the playdough and putting them in the basket just like in the story.

Outside, we will be exploring and learning about the different weather. Talking about what we need to wear each day and taking part in activities, such as splashing in puddles with wellington boots or waving coloured scarfs and ribbons in the wind.

Our nursery rhyme of the week is:

"If your happy and you know it".

Preschool Room

Next week in pre-school we will continue to learn about ourselves 'Let's Celebrate Me'. We will be reading the book 'It's Okay to Be Different' we will talk about ourselves and our families and draw pictures our families.

In the playdough we will be making bodies from loose parts and on the writing table we will be using our fine motor skills to draw people on a bus, inspired by **Rosa Parks**, as we continue to celebrate Black History Month.

Closing date for applications:

15 January 2024

If your child has an Education, Health & Care Plan (EHCP) the closing date is 31 October 2023.

www.telford.gov.uk/admissions

- You must apply if your child was born between 1 September 2019 – 31 August 2020.
- You must apply even if your child is attending a nursery or preschool on a school site or you have a child already attending the school.
- Attending a nursery does not guarantee a school place.
- School places are allocated in line with oversubscription criteria.
