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

Let's Celebrate Autumn

Baby Room

Next week we will be starting to celebrate Bonfire night, familiarising the babies to the sounds and colours of fireworks and the signs of Autumn.

Adults and babies will be modelling and making firework sounds such as pop, shhhh, zzzzz, whizz, bang, and crash. We will move along to the sounds and older babies will copy pretending to move like fireworks all babies will be moving using glittery and shiny materials.

We will look and listen to bonfires crackle and fizz as we watch what a bonfire looks like on the lpads. In our construction area we will explore different sized sticks, adults will model putting sticks on top of one another for dder babies to copy.

The children and adults will explore putting on and taking off hats and wellies in the role play area ready for all autumnal celebrations.

We will be learning about everyday family routines through actions and play within the role play area, learning how to drink from a cup, washing our hands in the sink area and cooking food in the oven.

We will be singing head, shoulders knees and toes, family fingers and 5 little pumpkins using Makaton and object reference to support our baby's language.

Let's explore mark making marks with paint, using colours and sparkles that can create fireworks or fires on large paper on the floor area. The children will explore how to move their fingers and hands through paint, learn how to hold egg crayons using their palmer grasps and move them across paper to make their own marks. Adults will encourage babies to name the actions and marks they make providing sounds and words for them to copy, slurping sounds, tap, slide, up and down.



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Toddlers and Preschool



Next week in the Toddler and preschool room for black history month we will be celebrating **Mae**Jemison (NASA astronaut) by creating rockets in the construction area.

"I wonder how tall you can build your rocket?"

On discovery education online, will be looking at video clips of fireworks getting ready for bonfire night. "I wonder what sounds you can hear?"

"Tell me what you can see?"

In the art studio we will be creating fire work paintings encouraging the children to use different vocabulary as they paint "bang, crash"

It is also a special week as we have 2 visitors coming into nursery!

On Tuesday 24th Rev Lisa is coming in to talk to us all about the harvest Festival.

On Thursday 26th our local Community Support Officer will be coming to talk to us about keeping safe on Bonfire night.

15 January 2024

If your child has an Education, Health & Care Plan (EHCP) the closing date is 31 October 2023.

www.telford.gov.uk/admissions

- You must apply if your child was born between 1 September 2019 – 31 August 2020.
- You must apply even if your child is attending a nursery or preschool on a school site or you have a child already attending the school.
- Attending a nursery does not guarantee a school place.
- School places are allocated in line with oversubscription criteria.
